Who Are You?

Since its inception in November 2008 the JamStats website has had over 54 000 hits, an average of 2 800 per month. Peak periods of use centre around the months of April, September and December as can be seen in Graph 1 on page 3.

This indicator has provided an estimate of our online users over the period and has been utilized as a measure for access and use of the on-line version of JamStats. However additional information was required for a more detailed analysis of the type of user visiting the site.



DID YOU KNOW THAT....? (Powered by JamStats 2009)

...the **labour force** consists of those who are employed plus those who are unemployed. It is the economically active portion of the population and is measured over a particular reference period. The unemployed comprises those persons looking for a job (active seekers) as well as those, although not looking for work, wanted work and were available, if offered. Individuals who are not working and who are not interested in work, are considered to be outside the labour force.

The Job Seeking Rate reflects the number of unemployed persons who had no job but were looking for work during the survey period expressed as a percentage of the employed and the active seekers. Traditionally males form the greater portion of the labour force, however the job seeking rate is higher among females.





JamStats is a database that captures information on some of Jamaica's most critical social and economic indicators. Using the DevInfo software developed by UNICEF, the Statistical Institute of Jamaica in partnership with the Planning Institute of Jamaica (PIOJ), with support from UNICEF Jamaica, has created a comprehensive database, which allows for tracking of key development signposts. Integrated with Microsoft Office, JamStats is able to generate three types of presentations linked to the database - tables, graphs and maps, along with reports that can be customized and formatted as required.



The ISSN (International Standard Serial Number) is an eight-digit number which identifies periodical publications, including electronic serials. It is used as an identifier and is linked to the title of the publication. The ISSN provides a useful and economical method of communication between publishers and suppliers. It also results in accurate citing of serials by scholars, researchers, abstracters, and librarians. ISSN is used in libraries for identifying titles, ordering and checking in, claiming serials and facilitates interlibrary loans.
